The EU Digital Single Market Copyright Directive (DSMCD) is currently being transposed into law within the EU Member States. The Directive establishes new reporting obligations and requirements regarding authors/directors/performer's compensation; creates the risk of rights revocation if copyrighted works are unexploited; and seeks to expand online access to copyrighted works by creating new rules on use of protected works online and also a voluntary distribution mechanism.

Producers (and their lawyers) assembling a production or licensing distribution into the EU need to know how these provisions apply to future transactions between EU and non-EU parties; how they may affect pre-existing agreements (including collectively bargained labor agreements); what measures can be over-ridden by contract/a foreign choice of law; and which territories have deviated significantly in their implementation of the Directive.

Session 1, Part I will provide an overview of the most significant provisions of the Directive and will consider the mandatory overriding provisions, limitations on contractual freedom, and issues of conflicts of law. Part II will focus on the practical matters that must be taken into consideration in determining rights and obligations in production and distribution agreements.
